- 3 Some Pharisees came to him to test him. They asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any and every reason?"
- 4 "Haven't you read," he replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,'
- 5 and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'?
- 6 So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."
- 7 "Why then," they asked, "did Moses command that a man give his wife a certificate of divorce and send her away?"
- 8 Jesus replied, "Moses permitted you to divorce your wives because your hearts were hard. But it was not this way from the beginning.
- 9 I tell you that anyone who divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality, and marries another woman commits adultery."
- 10 The disciples said to him, "If this is the situation between a husband and wife, it is better not to marry."
- 11 Jesus replied, "Not everyone can accept this word, but only those to whom it has been given. **Matthew 19:3-11**

They intentionally pursue **relationship** with Jesus, the creator of marriage.

Jesus points us back to Himself, His word, and His purpose.

Circle

Moses permitted you to divorce your wives because your hearts were hard.

They stopped trying to **change** their spouse and started trying to **change** themselves.

Hardness of Heart means becoming unresponsive to the **word** and **will** of God.

Commitment

What God has joined together, let no one separate.

They become **ruthlessly** committed to marriage.

2/3 of unhappy couples who stayed together were happy 5 years later.

Community

The disciples said to him, "If this is the situation between a husband and wife, it is better not to marry."

They are fully **known** and **connected** to others within their church family.

The right **people** provide the right **influence**.
